Guidelines for caring for an infant, child, or young person ...

infants/children/young people require enteral feeding. Improve communication and documentation processes between hospital and community for infant/children/young people that require enteral feeding. Note: This guideline excludes neonates/ pre-term babies because their physiology is different to that of an older baby.
