General Directions for Administering the Words Their Way ...

Ask students to number their paper (or prepare a numbered paper for kindergarten or early first grade). Call each word aloud and repeat it. Say each word naturally, without empha-sizing phonemes or syllables. Use it in a sentence, if necessary, to be sure students know the exact word. Sample sentences are provided along with the words.

Additionally, the CORE Phoneme Segmentation Test or other tests of phoneme awareness can be administered to isolate phoneme awareness as an underlying factor. Older struggling readers who score at Intensive levels will need basic phonics instruction, possibly including instruction in phonemic awareness and sound/spelling correspondences.
